

Key Problems

Problem 1.

Solve the Kuhn-Tucker problems:

- a) $\max f(x,y,z) = x - 2y + z$ when $x^2 + y^2 + z^2 \leq 3$
- b) $\max f(x,y,z,w) = xz + yw$ when $x^2 + y^2 \leq 1$ and $4z^2 + 9w^2 \leq 36$

Problem 2.

Solve the Kuhn-Tucker problems:

- a) $\max f(x,y,z) = x^2y^2z^2$ when $x^2 + y^2 + z^2 + x^2y^2z^2 \leq 4$
- b) $\max f(x,y) = \ln(x^2y) - x - y$ when $x \geq 1$, $y \geq 1$ and $x + y \geq 4$
